Chairmans Message

Hello members, firstly, may I say a big thank you, to all the people, who attended our recent, club meeting. It was very dismal and uninviting weather, that evening, but, it was good to see so many people present.

Our February meeting, is concerned with the Asian Hornet. The speaker, is the unfortunate beekeeper, who found the hornet taking his bees, at his Apairy, at Morthoe, North Devon. He will explain the issues he had in obtaining support, in dealing with this pest.

Whilst it may not seem relevant, to some Beekeepers, the threat of this insect, cannot be overstated. There were four incidents of actual hornets, in the U.K. two of which required actual live nest being removed. It is most probable, that Beekeepers will be the first, to encounter these pest. It seems the queen starts nest building and taking in protein in February. If this is the case, those of us who have out apiaries as well as those close to the home, will need to be very careful and check regularly.

At present, both B.B.K.A and D.B.K.A are putting plans into place to assist, in the control, of these hornets. As soon as we have the correct and accurate information, we will release that to you.

I would advise you to attend the meeting on the 15th. February to enable you to gain as much information, as possible, from someone who has experienced the problem first hand.

Following on from that, our April meeting, has been reserved, for nosema testing of members bees. Again as you are aware, this disease can have a negative effect, on your colony, if you have the disease, so, if you know, it can be dealt with early and allow your bees, to be fully productive.
